This is Bilbao Bizkaia. Surrounded by the sea and mountains, the province borders on Gipuzkoa and Araba-Álava, with the three making up the Basque Autonomous Community.

Many small and larger towns reflect their industrial past, along with chartered towns and cities of great historical value, where customs and contemporary culture coexist like nowhere else.

And with Bilbao, the province's capital and internationally renowned as a city of interest, at its very heart.

This map is divided into districts to make it easier to help you to choose the place you want to visit, whether close to the coast or in any of the beautiful inland valleys.

Off on an **ADVENTURE**

Our region's nature and its people are one of its main draws. There are many different experiences on offer as the best way to learn about them.

Some showcase what is typical of our region and the lifestyle of our people, while others offer the chance of an adventure in the countryside or on water; they all provide a hands-on experience to discover a vibrant and often intriguing land where visitors are sure of a warm welcome.



Hands-on RURAL EXPERIENCES

There is no better way to explore the places you visit than by actively taking part in local activities, such as cooking typical dishes, visiting a *Baserri* (traditional farmhouse)... in short, enjoying your rural experience through nature and your surroundings.



Discover a Baserri

The traditional farmhouse (*Baserria*) is a typically Basque building with a rich history dating back generations and with a special kind of beauty that blends into the surrounding landscape. Its market gardens, its animals... Being a *baserritarra* (farmer) and part of the farm, while also learning a few words in the Basque language, is a thoroughly enjoyable experience.

Organic farming

Visit organic market gardens to buy fruit, leafy and root vegetables, and flowers that are environmentally friendly and healthy. Many are open to the public at different times of the year.

Bread making

Then learn to make your own bread using that flour or from other grains. There's nothing more delicious than freshly baked bread.

Flour mills

As if time has stood still, the mill stones continue to move at the pace of the water currents as they grind corn into flour.



Shepherd for a day

Find out what it is like to be a shepherd or shepherdess. Enjoy time outdoors with some professional shepherds, learn to make cheese and delight at the many tales they have to tell.



Leather workshop

Handcrafts run by experts to find out about the thousand and one different shapes and uses of leather. Learn these techniques first-hand and make your first item



Basque Pelota University

Learn about this internationally well-known, traditional Basque sport. Mano (handball), pala (bat) or cesta punta (pointed basket)... and if you get the chance, experience a pelotaz match day and get caught up in the unique atmosphere.



'Talo' making

A Talo is a cornflour pancake, a staple of the Basque Country since time immemorial. Wrap it around chorizo, txistorra (fresh paprika sausage), bacon or, if you have a sweet tooth, chocolate.

At Enkarterri, nature is at its best seen in the splendour of its valleys, mountains, sea and caves such as Pozalagua with the greatest collection of eccentric stalactites in the world. Yet the land has an important industrial past, some examples of which are the 15th century El Pobal ironworks at Muskiz, the Museum of Mining at Abanto-Zierbena, the La Arboleda reservoir at Trapagarán and the beret factory at la Encartada in Balmaseda. The heritage to be found in places such as Balmaseda or Lanestosa is also worth a special mention.

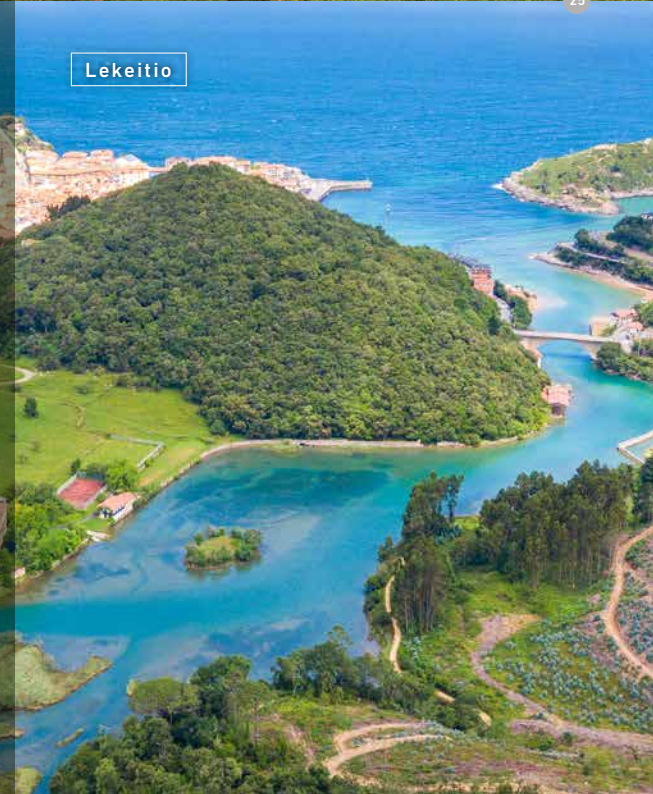
This prominently Basque-speaking district looks out to sea, although it also boasts magnificent green valleys off the beaten tracks and villages with heritage gems, such as the churches of **Lekeitio** and **Ondarroa**, the **Markina-Xemein** complex and the **Monastery of Ziortza Bolivar**.

Sea lovers can visit the **Santa Catalina Lighthouse** which is an interpretation centre or, just a stone's throw away, at Mendexa, the **tide mill at Marierrota**.

Another highlight is the excellent cuisine featuring freshly-caught fish and locally-grown vegetables; this culinary heritage of the district can be enjoyed at the ports or at local farmhouses.

Wherever you decide to go, it will be sure to be the right choice! As the accommodation here is in Baserris or traditional Basque farmhouses home to many **stories and legends** that you'll certainly hear about.

This district, sheltered by the peak of the **Anboto** and the Aramotz Mountains in **Urkiola Natural Park**, is **breathtakingly beautiful**. The foothills are home to artistic and cultural heritage gems, such as the church of Santa María, ancestral homes, the Cross of Kurutzia in **Durango** and the Argiñeta necropolis in **Elorrio**.

The **Sanctuary of Urkiola** right in the Natural Park is the site of traditional and religious pilgrimages.

Gorbeia

Gorbeia, the green heart of the Basque Country, is a destination of mountains, dotted with traditional farmhouses (baserris) and small rural settlements. The **Gorbeia Natural Park** is its mountain centre par excellence, with its iconic cross on the summit, at an altitude of 1,480 metres. What's more, the district offers a host of activities that you can check out at the Tourist Information Office in Orozko. Towns such as Ubide, the highest in Bizkaia, Otxandio with its beech woods and its iron ore mining tradition. The old quarters of Zeanuri and Areatza, and Orozko itself, are a great outdoor museum, making Gorbeia an authentic and diverse destination with its varied natural and cultural heritage.

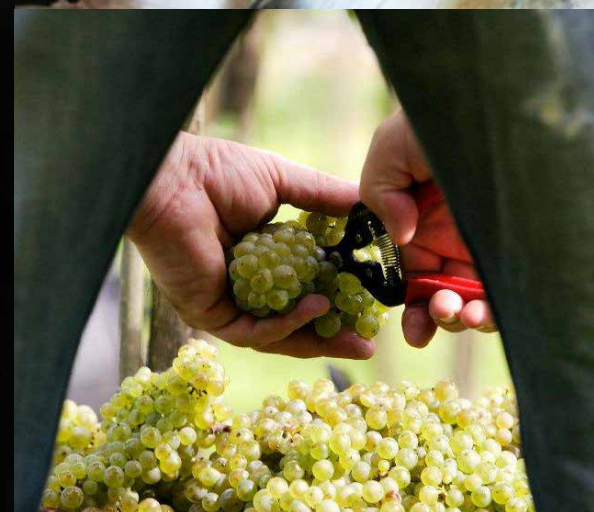

TYPICAL FROM HERE

Bilbao Bizkaia boasts wide range of locally-sourced gourmet products of the finest quality, which are often the base of the excellent cuisine here.

MARKET GARDENS

Market gardens provide tomatoes, runner beans, leeks, pulses, lettuces... many of which bear the Eusko label or Euskalbaserri quality labels.

Typical produce includes the famous Zalla purple onions in Enkarterri and the Gernika peppers. And the delicious pulse dishes, there's nothing like beans cooked with all the trimmings.

PINTXOS (TAPAS)

These bite-sized delicacies are the best cuisine on offer in many of the bars and taverns.

The difficulty lies in deciding which one to choose.

LOCALLY RAISED MEAT

It is difficult not to link the cuisine of Bilbao Bizkaia with "a good steak". That red meat, char-grilled at restaurants, cider houses and carveries, and served rare on a sharing platter in the centre of the table.

SEAFOOD

Anchovies, baby squid, sea bass, bonito and tuna when in season and, above all, salt cod, which is cooked in many ways here: the famous pil-pil in sizzling oil, Biscay-style, Aojarriero (in tomato and garlic sauce) or the Club Ranero-style (with garlic and red-pepper cream sauce) are all wonderful recipes that never change over time and are difficult to find with a similar quality in other places.

PASTRIES AND CAKES

You'll find a huge range of pastries and cakes, such as the Basque Cake with its creamy filling, butter balls, the rice cake, Rusos (layers of nut-based meringue and buttercream), Jesuitas puff pastries, and the famous Carolinas (custard tarts topped with meringue). The oribaltzak from Gernika, the Cocotes de Markina sponge cakes, the truffles from Bilbao and the lard biscuits from Orduña are some of the other well-known delights. At Christmas, Sokonusko nougat is a must, and Malvavisco sweets if you have a sore throat

CHEESES

Primarily the Idiazabal Designation of Origin in its two varieties, smoked or unsmoked. This cheese is made with Latxa or Carranzana sheep's milk and is highly acclaimed in international competitions.

We have ordered these routes according to difficulty and length, so that you can choose the one that best suits your mood and ability. The options include long-distance trails (GR), short-distance trails (PR), the Way of St James and The Way of St Ignatius. There are also the greenways, former railway routes, and the places of interest for short trips, but equally worth seeing.

So pack your backpack, get your snacks ready, put on your trainers or boots, and get going! Aurrera, as we say in Basque!

In general, this map shows the **layout of each trail** and the **places of interest** for short trips.

Gather as much information as possible before setting off on any of these trails to make sure you reach your destination safely and not get lost along the way.

TRAILS & WALKS

a good lunch
in your backpack

Bilbao Bizkaia is home to many natural treasures such as the Gorbeia, Urkiola and Armañón Natural Parks, Pozalagua caves, or the source of the Nervión river with its breathtaking viewpoint. Apart from these must-visit places, here are some easier trails, suitable for the whole family, that you can either do on foot, on your bike and, sometimes, on horseback.

38

ENKARTERRI

Let's start with this district, whose history revolves around mining and industry, by suggesting an outing along **the Ironworks Trail (2)** along the River Barbadun. The trail starts at Galdames and goes as far as La Arena beach. The sights along the way include Valdivia Mill and La Olla and El Poblal forges; the latter can be visited and features a curious bamboo woodland.

Further south, Mount **Balgerri (1)** rises up to over 1,000 metres in the Ordunte mountain range, between the Mena valley in the province of Burgos and Karrantza. Make time to explore the oak and beech groves around Ordunta reservoir.

Mount **Kolitzza (3)** is closer to Balmaseda; the Romanesque Shrine Chapel of San Sebastian y San Roque stands on the iconic summit and offers stunning panoramic views.



GORBEIA AND ORDUÑA

The next stop is the town of Orduña, where you can visit the spectacular waterfall marking the **source of the river Nervión (10)**.

You can also opt to take the extremely popular **Txarlazo route (11)** which will take you right to the top, where Sanctuary Church of Our Lady of la Antigua sanctuary stands and which can be seen almost anywhere in the valley. Bird lovers will enjoy the sightings along this route, **(12)** including the peregrine falcon, the Egyptian vulture and the griffon vulture.



Take time to leisurely explore **Artea (4)** and take in the character of its neighbourhoods, with ancient shrine chapels here and there, and surrounded by the typical Basque countryside, dotted with traditional farmhouses. There are just three kilometres between Artea and the town of **Areatza (6)**. In this beautiful town, you can take a short walk through its quaint old quarter, declared a monumental site where stunning palaces and Baroque manor houses will take you back in time.

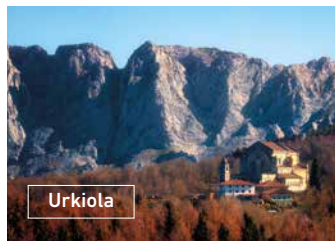
Make your way from the Arratia valley across Bikotzgane bridge to **Orozko** valley, where you take the Altzagorta trail.

This trail will bring you to Atxulo, one of the natural stone entrances

to the Itzina karstic massif; it is also an opportunity to learn first-hand the importance of woodland in the Gorbeia landscape, as you cross small beech groves and conifer plantations.

DURANGALDEA

The trail starts in Durango and goes into **Urkiola Natural Park (21)**, a must-visit mountain area which boasts a rich variety of fauna and the well-known summit of mount Anboto. On your way, visit the monastery of San Antonio de Urkiola and its surroundings. Legend has it that if single people walk around the stone standing outside the monastery, they will find their partner.



Iurreta is a site of heritage interest which also has two interesting trails, former paths that were once trodden by herdsmen and traders, commercial paths and tracks. These are the **North Trail and the South Trail (19)**, both with a short-distance option.

We are now going to suggest a **bridleway: Zaldi Gorri (20)**. This is a loop trail above the valley on either side of the Ibaizabal river basin. This 90 km long bridleway starts at Amorebieta-Etxano and goes through 12 municipalities.

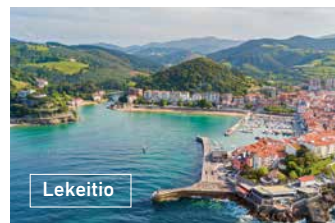
Ibarruri-Unda-Maume (13) are three former elizates (an early form of local government in the Basque Country), forming Muxika. This trail is dotted with Gothic or Medieval shrine chapels, ancient traditional farmhouses and the remains of Olea forge.

LEA-ARTIBAI

The trail starts out from the Shrine Chapel of San Miguel de Arretxinaga in Markina-Xemein. This walk along the River Urko, **Urko bidea (7)**, provides an insight into the natural and cultural heritage of the area.

Going towards the sea, **the Artibai (8)** trail runs from Gardotza industrial estate to the River Artibai marshes at Ondarroa.

Another interesting trail is the loop that starts and ends in the fishing village of **Lekeitio**, taking in Mount **Otoio** and the village of **Ispaster (9)**.



The **Lea Ibilbidea** trail is a very interesting route that runs alongside the River Lea after which it is named.

There are many sites of interest to discover, such as the Marierrota tide mill at Mendexa, constructed in 1555 for the purpose of standing in for the river water mills in times of drought or, in Gizaburuaga, the important Bengolea Ironworks and Bengolea Tower House which played a key role in the history of the valley. At Munitibar, the plot of land belonging to Bengola, occupied since the 14th century by one of the oldest ironworks to be documented in Bizkaia, has been converted into the Renewable Energy and the Lea valley Interpretation Centre.

URDAIBAI

The Royal Bridleway **(14)** between Bermeo and Gernika is another recommended route. For centuries,

this by pilgrims, merchants and even by the Kings of Castile on their way to the church to swear an oath to recognise and maintain the Charter of Privileges and thus be recognised as the Lords of Biscay. This was done at the Oath Church of Santa Eufemia in Bermeo.



The small village of Nabarniz, is the starting point to climb **Mount Illun-tzar (15)** (726 metres), one of the summits with the most beautiful views of Urdaibai and the Bay of Biscay.

URIBE

Lazama marks the start of the **Goitioltza trail (16)**, that can be done on foot or by bike. It runs through Txakoli vineyards and past traditional farmhouses such as the one at Oxangoiti. You'll also get the chance to see the famous training grounds of the Athletic Club de Bilbao.

The **Bazaldu loop trail (17)** starts and ends at Laukiz, with some sections going into Gatika. It is a tree-lined trail, running alongside the River Butron in some stretches.



The next trail is once again by the Bay of Biscay, running along the **cliffs to Sopela, Barrika and Plentzia (18)**. Start from the Barinatxe beach in Sopela and, following a route that runs parallel to the cliffs, bordering other beaches such as Atxabiribil and Meñakoz. From there you'll reach Barrika and then Plentzia.

GREENWAY TRAILS

ARRAZOLA

This trail marks the route of the former Arrazola mining railroad, with the Aurrera steam locomotive at the head. It runs along the foot of the mythological summit of Anboto and crosses the beautiful valley of Atxondo, the river Arrazola river plain, right up to the elizate of Apatamonasterio.

ATXURI

The footprint of the much-missed "Chocolatera", a train that revolutionised trading in Mungia district, is now a peaceful path that opens onto the Butrón river valley.

MONTES DE HIERRO

This is in some way a journey through the very core of our history, for centuries shaped by the mining of iron ore and which forged what today is Greater Bilbao.

ITSASLUR

A spectacular result, as it hangs over the cliffs of the western-most coast of Bizkaia. The former mining railroad of El Cobarón to Campomar has become a walkway high on the cliffs and an outdoor learning experience, with views over the Cantabrian coast.

ORKONERA

The former La Orkonera mining railroad has become a magnificent bidegorri (bike lane) along the foot of the Triano mountains, throughout Atlantic vegetation. It is interspersed with tunnels and also offers some stunning views over the Somorrostro valley.

KADAGUA

This greenway, along the former section of the La Robla railway between Balmaseda and Irauregi, provides a magnificent route alongside the Kadagua river

CHARMING SPOTS

that are not to be missed

It goes without saying that these are just some of the places with a special charm that you'll find during your visit to Bizkaia. However, these are some particular must-visits, because of their originality, views or setting, in a land of unique spots.

NERVION WATERFALL

Its 222 metre drop makes it the highest in the Iberian peninsula.

The river rises at the border with Araba-Alava and Burgos and runs through the valley until it reaches Bizkaia at the town of Orduña. It's well worth a visit in winter or during the spring thaw when the water flow is at its highest.

FORUA ROMAN SETTLEMENT (Forua)

Standing on the Elexalde hill, this is the most important Roman monument in Bizkaia. An archaeological study has documented the existence of a walled settlement covering approximately 15 hectares.

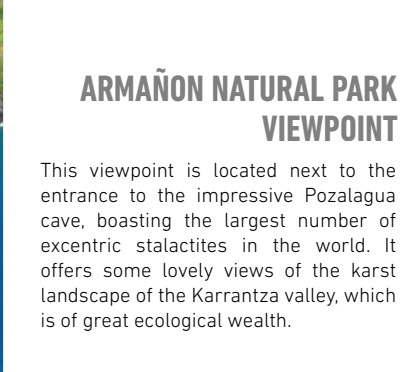

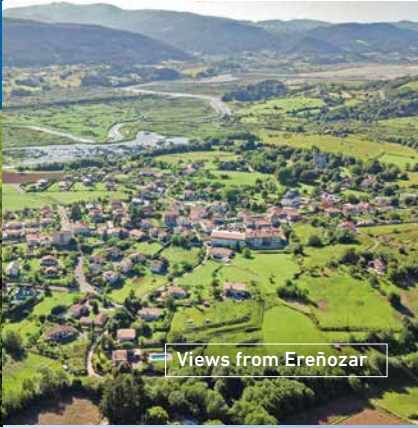
SHRINE CHAPEL OF SANTA CATALINA (Mundaka)

Its spectacular location right by the sea not only offers some stunning views but also makes it a strategic point for watching over the entrance to the estuary, looking out towards the island of Izaro or the Ogoño cragg.

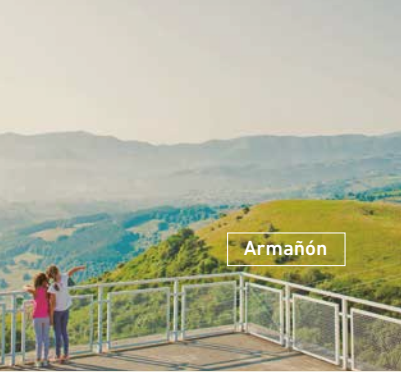


ARMAÑON NATURAL PARK VIEWPOINT

This viewpoint is located next to the entrance to the impressive Pozalagua cave, boasting the largest number of excentric stalactites in the world. It offers some lovely views of the karst landscape of the Karrantza valley, which is of great ecological wealth.

This is one of the many natural vantage points offering stunning views of the Urdaibai Biosphere Reserve.

It stands in a beautiful setting of large green meadows and many mountain areas. Numerous shrine chapels are dotted around the municipality. Particularly noteworthy is the old quarter of Libao with its elegant neoclassical Church of San Martín and iconic boundary cross of the Holy Christ.



LA ARBOLEDA (Trapagaran)

This is one of the few still remaining mining villages in Bizkaia. It was declared a Monumental Site in 2003.

Its former mines, now converted into artificial lagoons, create a unique, surprising landscape.

Orozko, specifically the Elezkin recreational area, offers unrivalled views of this karstic massif, in Gorbeia Natural Park.

LARRABETZU

It was declared a Monumental Complex due to its medieval architecture, which can still be recognised today. It is located on the Way of St James and the Rutas Juraderas (routes of the oath) of the lords of Biscay, which has gradually shaped its character over the centuries.

LENDOÑOBEITI WATER MILL (Lendoño de abajo)

Visit this restored water mill to learn about its history and that of the rest of the hamlets of Ruzabal, dating back more than 500 years. The mill is fed by the waters rising in the spring of Iturrigorri.

BOLUNBURU MONUMENTAL

This monumental site is one of the best examples of a feudal complex in Bilbao Bizkaia and comprises a tower house, the beautiful Shrine Chapel of Santa Ana (1610), the ruins of the forge and the mill, together with a spacious strip of land to soak up the sun or do some sport.

Castro de Bolunburu, a fortified settlement from the second Iron Age, is nearby and stands on a hillock at an altitude of 320 metres and protected by the Kadagua river.

SALDROPO WETLANDS (Zeanuri)

Located at the foot of the Atxuri crags. This delightful plain is home to a special ecosystem with aquatic vegetation and species of great ecological importance.

AMOROTO SQUARE

Particularly noteworthy is the church, the Renaissance town hall with a lovely balcony looking onto the square, and the Abadetxea traditional farmhouse, which is a typical 19th century Neoclassical construction.

PRESAZELAI BEECHWOOD (Otxandio)

This beautiful beechwood on the banks of the River Urkiola is magical and mysterious in autumn with its carpet of red leaves.

TRADITIONAL FARMHOUSES AT ISPASTER

With its back to the sea breeze, this municipality is quintessentially Basque, where the "Baserris" (traditional farmhouses) and fields of crops stand out in its green landscape.

BESAIDE (Elorrio)

This is an iconic point of the Basque Country as given that it is where the three Basque provinces meet.

An amazing sculpture by the Japanese artist Yoshin Ogata and a monument to missing climbers by the architect, Pueyo stand on its summit.

TXAULAS (Shepherds' shelters)

In Bizkaia Tologorri is one of the must-climb peaks. You'll come across the shelters housing the cattle and you'll get the opportunity to take some stunning photos.

This shrine capital dominates the rocky summit of Mount Urregarai. A delightful path between birch trees and cypresses brings you to the foot of the summit where a flight of 222 stone steps takes you up to shrine chapel on the terrace.

This small village, located in the foothills of Mount Oiiz, is considered to be the vantage point of Durangaldea. From there you can admire the scenic beauty of the district.

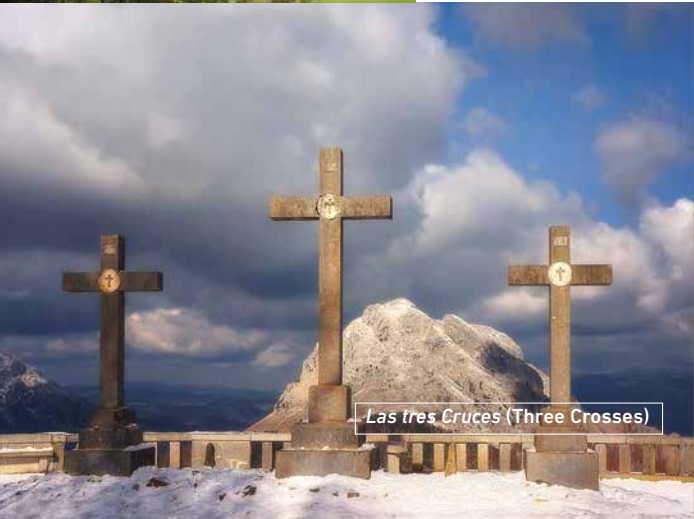

LAS TRES CRUCES (THE THREE CROSSES) VIEWPOINT (Abadiño/Urkiola)

The trail that will take you to the viewpoint starts by the Sanctuary Church of San Antonio de Urkiola. It is a Via Crucis among beech woods, ending in three enormous crosses and at the viewpoint, offering a stunning panoramic view over the Atxarte gorge and the whole area of Durangaldea. There is an interpretation panel which will help you to identify the surrounding hills.

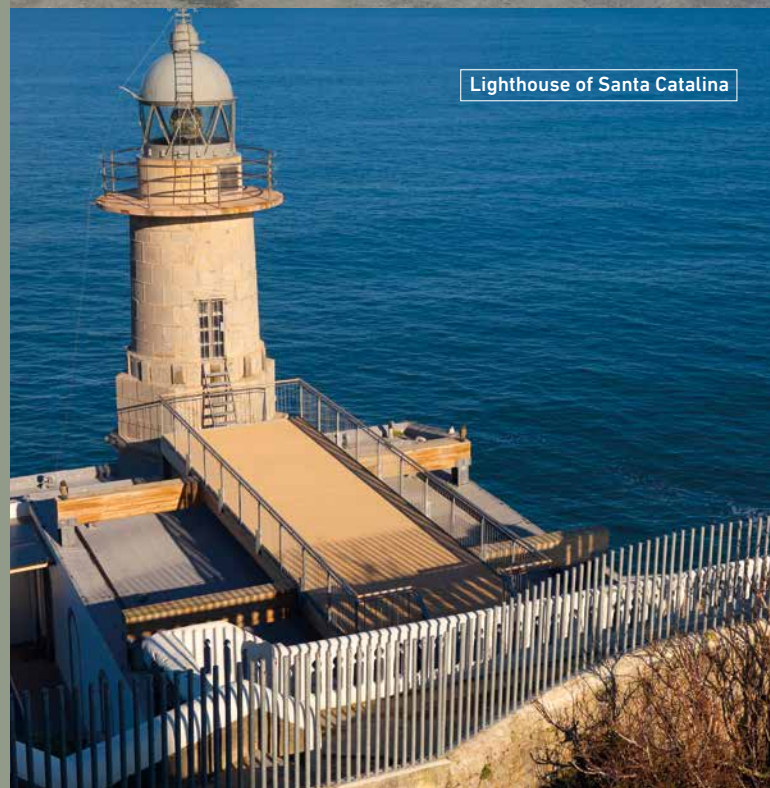

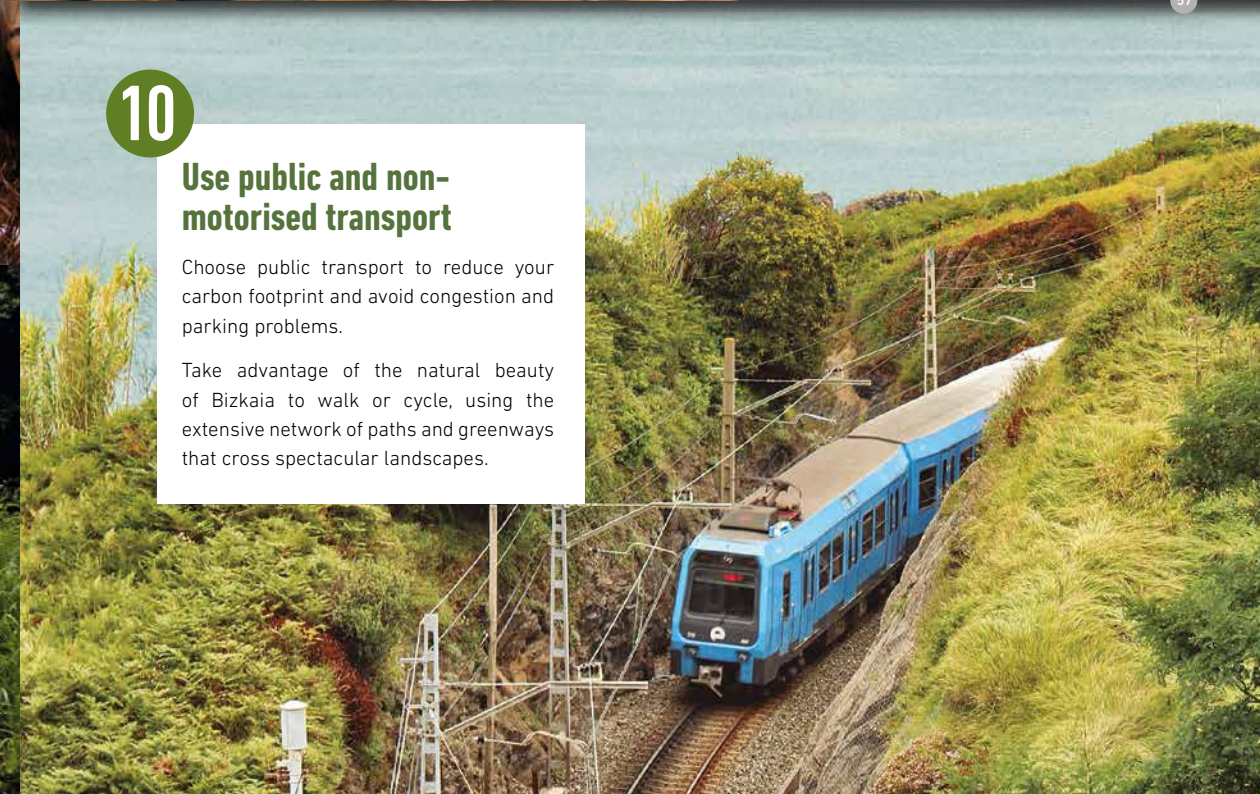
